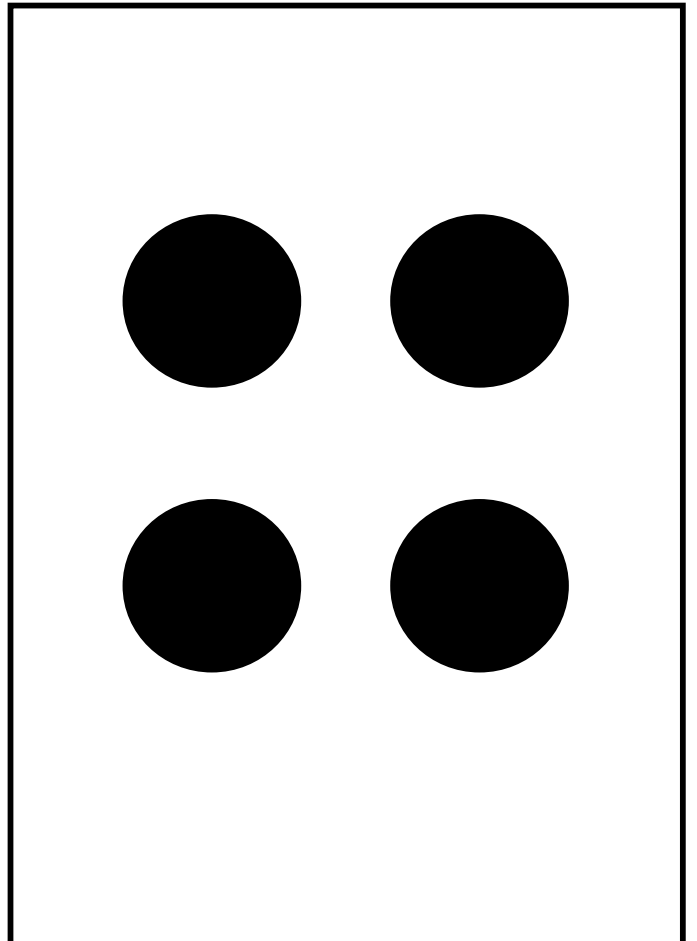
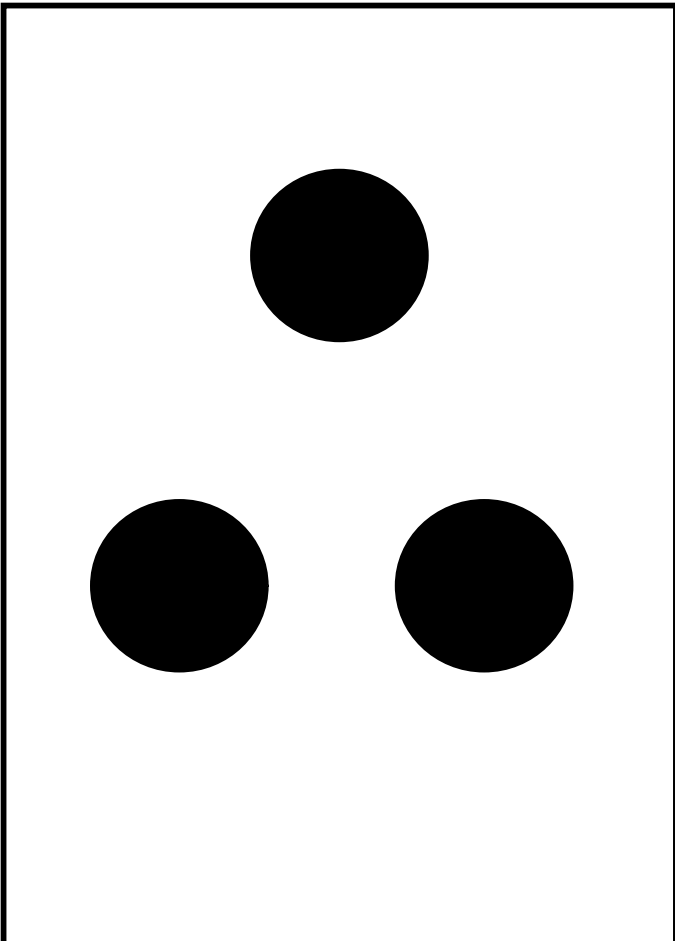
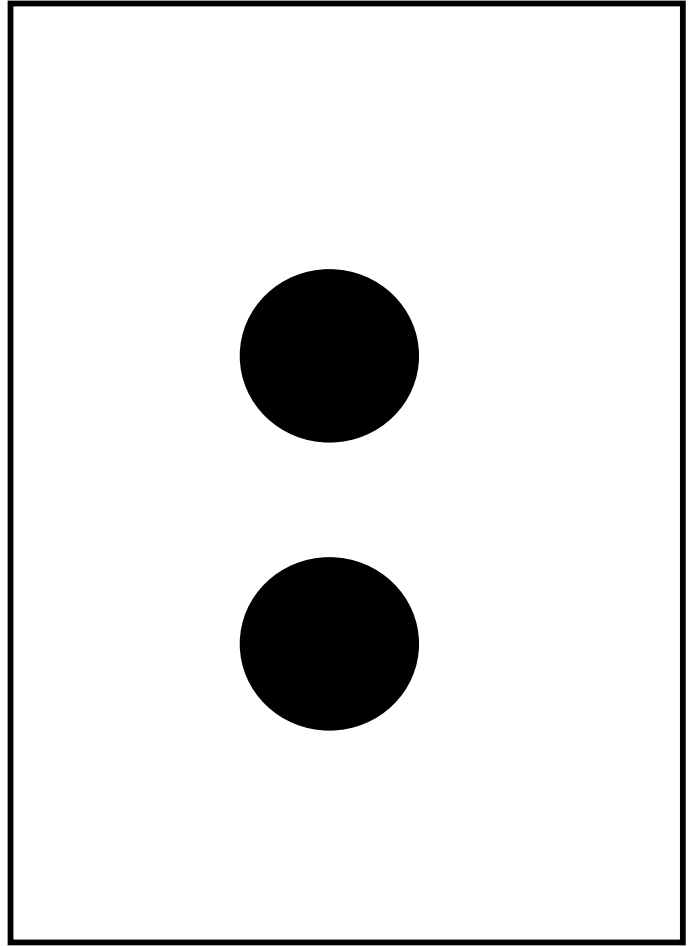
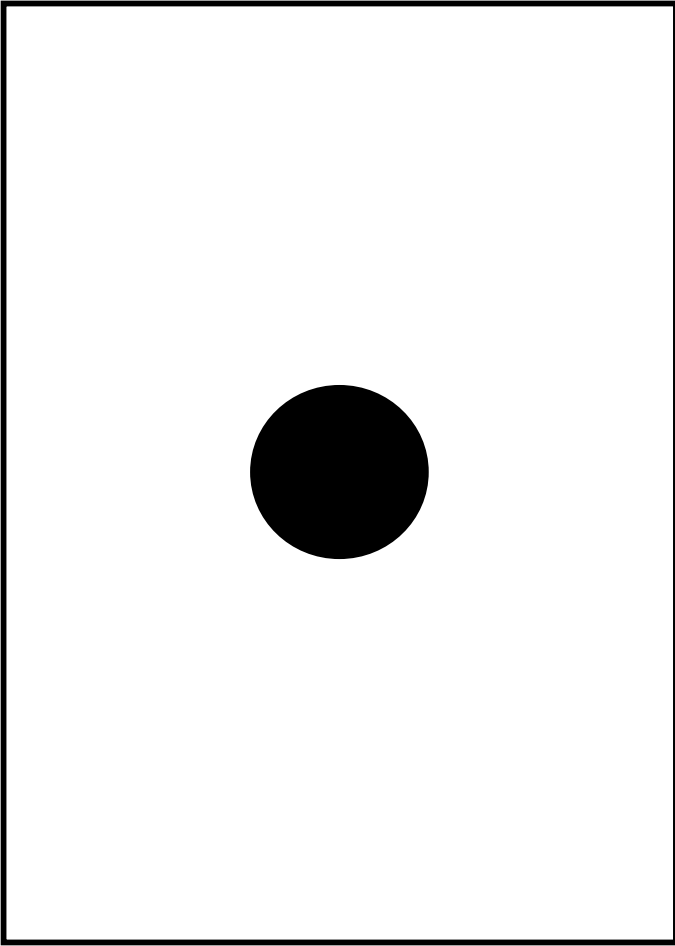
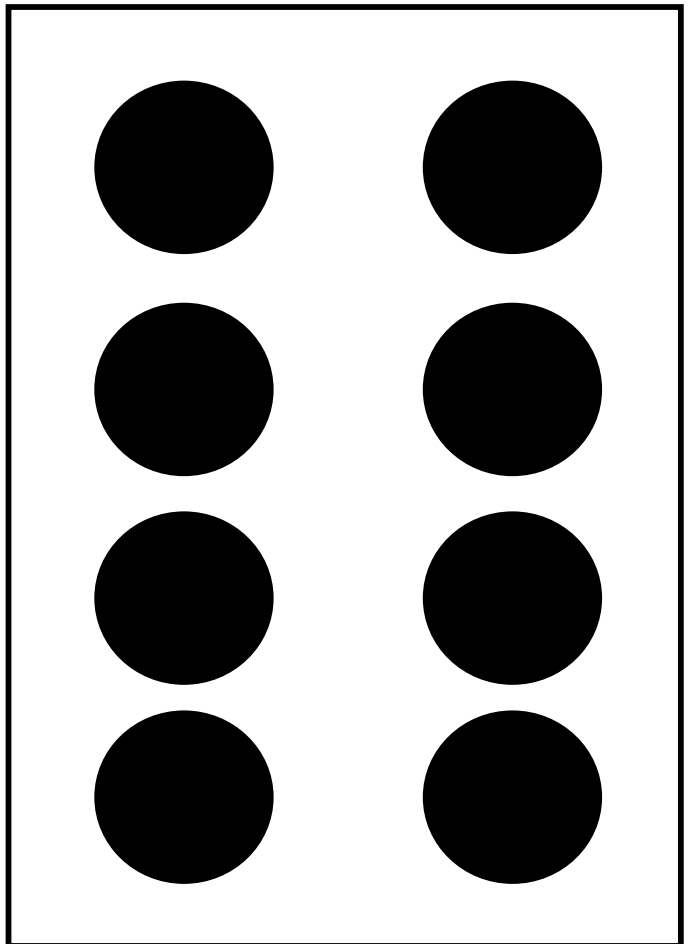
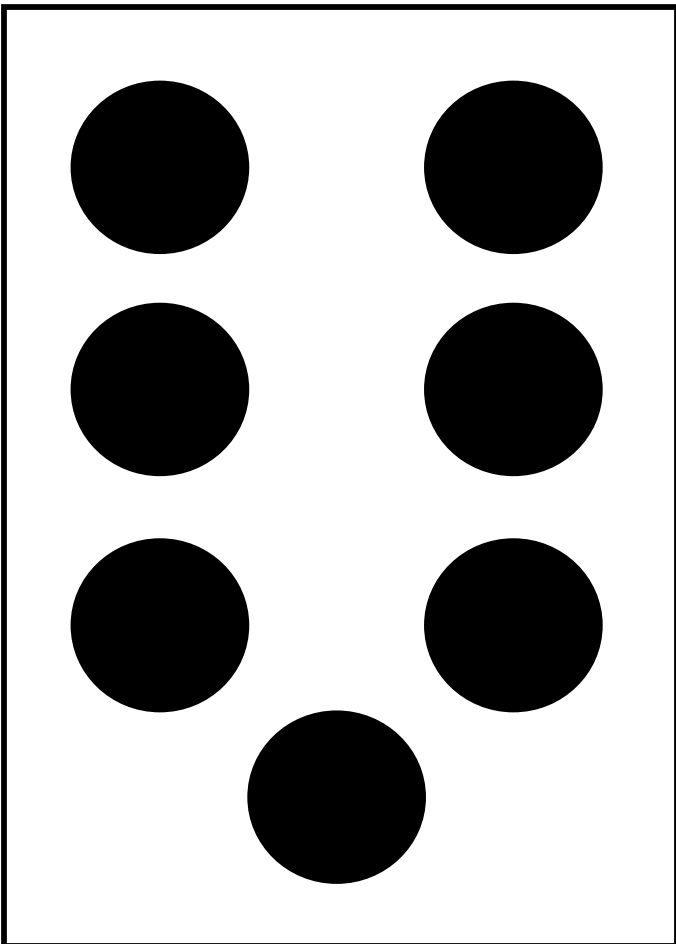
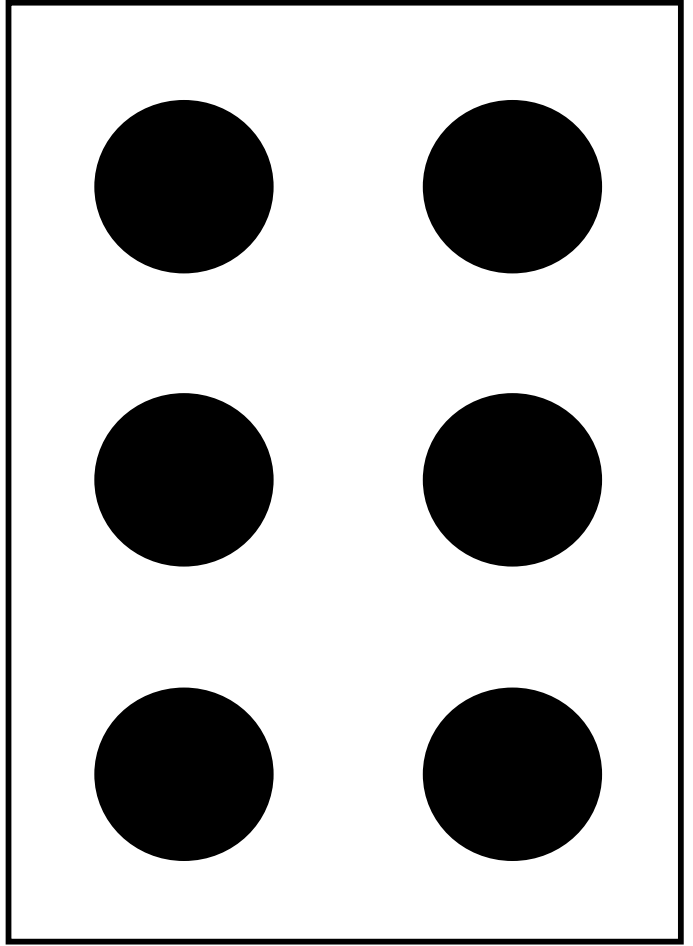
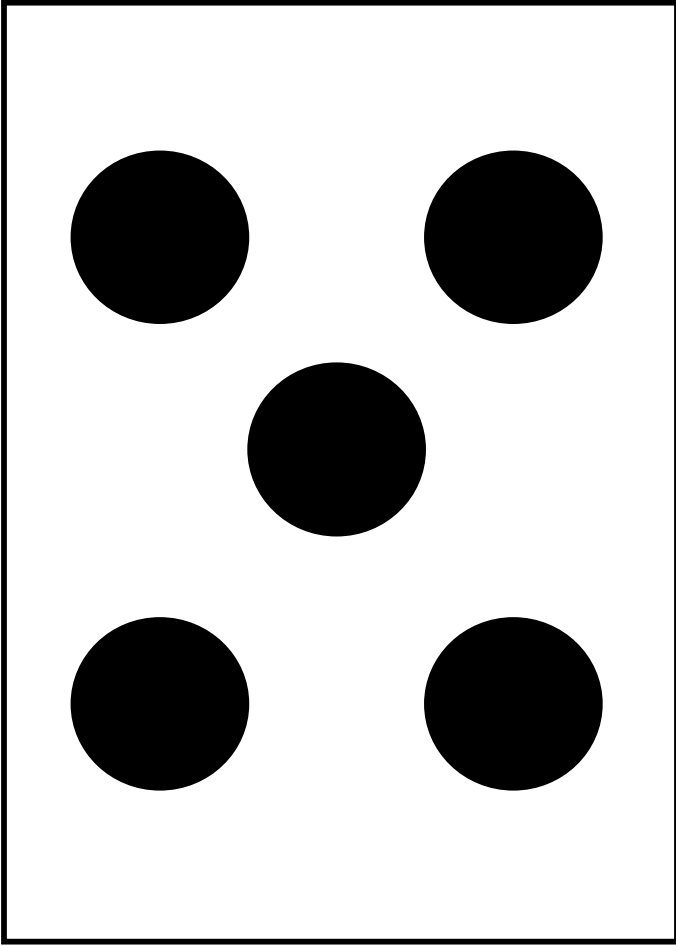
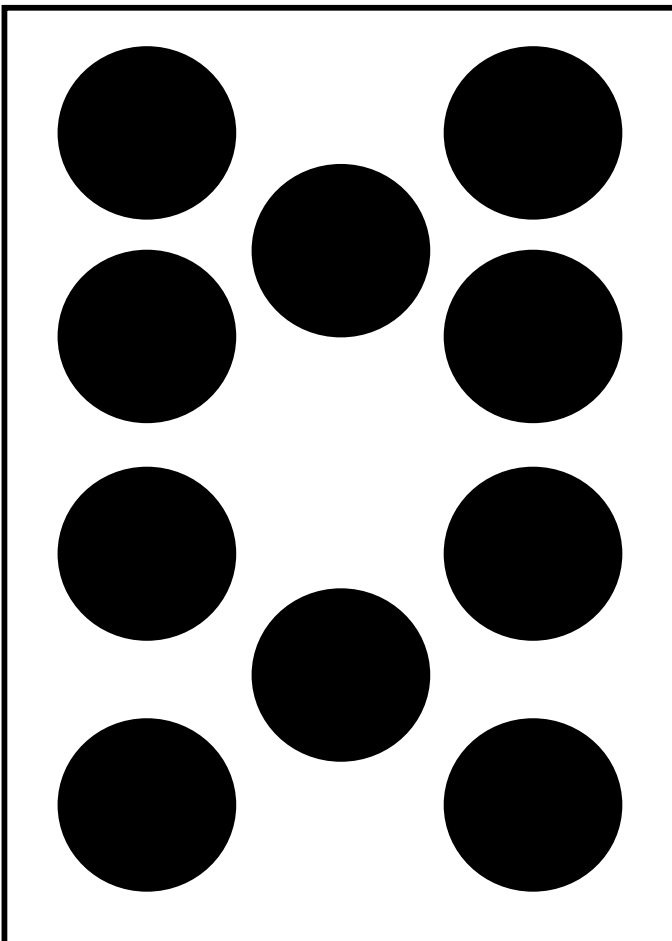
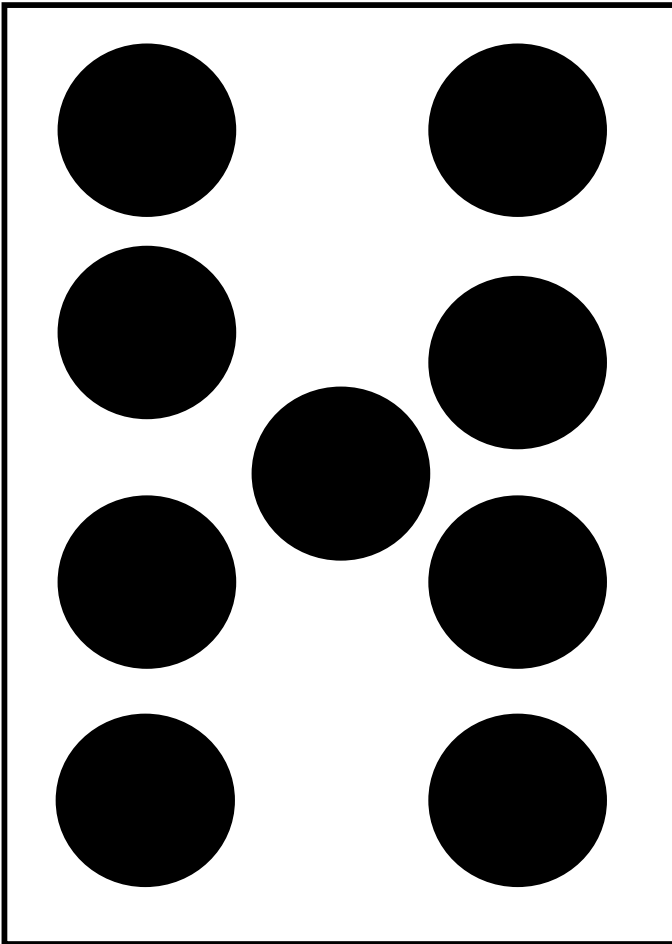


**SUBITISING CARDS**







***How to use these subitising cards with your child:***

Print the cards and cut out so there are 10 cards.

Start from 1. Place the cards in front of your child, one at a time. Ask your child to say the number of dots on each card.

To begin with, give your child enough time to say the number on the card. The more confident they become at stating the number, give them less time to say the number.

Encourage your child not to count the dots, but say the number of dots that they see.

Your child can also show the number of dots on the card on their fingers.

You can ask your child to write the number of dots on a white board or a piece of paper.

Have your child arrange the cards in order of lowest to highest, or highest to lowest.

When your child is confident at saying the number of dots on the cards, then give your child two cards and ask them to add them together. What's the new number?

Can your child make combinations of 5 and 12 using the cards?

Print two sets of these cards, cut them out and play 'memory'.
