## **Empowerment and Participation of Children**

Children have the right to give their views and opinions about decisions that affect them and to be listened to.

Empowerment is about helping children to have their say. Acting to empower children should always guide the work of Kilberry Valley Primary School. Participation is important for children because it gives them an opportunity to have a say about issues and decisions that affect them. Children are more likely to speak up about their concerns about feeling unsafe, or make a complaint, if they feel their views are valued and welcomed.

#### Benefits of empowering & supporting the participation of children:

- Participation and empowerment are vital components of a child safe school that benefits children, families and staff.
- Involving and consulting with children enables Kilberry Valley PS to improve its policies, practices and services as children provide a unique voice regarding what makes them feel safe and unsafe.
- Facilitating the empowerment and participation of children enhances a culture of child safety and listening to children within Kilberry Valley PS.
- Children and young people learn new skills, build self-esteem and develop an understanding of collaboration and rights.
- Children are more likely to report abuse or concerns if they feel safe and empowered in their school.
- Children feel their views are valued and listened to. Children are more likely to support the outcome if they have been involved.
- Increases engagement.
- Reduces absences.
